Your program must be a tested intervention that includes the following:

- Findings published in a peer-reviewed journal
- One or more statistically significant positive outcomes (behavioral or psychosocial outcomes among individuals, communities, or populations)
- Evidence demonstrated in at least one study using an experimental or quasi-experimental design
- English-language materials that program planners can use in a US community or clinical setting
- Evaluation completed within the past 10 years
