- findings published in a peer-reviewed journal

- one or more statistically significant positive outcomes (behavioral or psychosocial outcomes among individuals, communities, or populations)
- evidence demonstrated in at least one study using an experimental or quasi-experimental design
- English-language materials that program planners can use in a U.S. community or clinical setting
- evaluation completed within the past 10 years
