# IMPLEMENTATION GUIDE Lung Cancer Screening Decision Tool (LCSDecTool)

Using an evidence-based program to develop a process model for program delivery in the practice setting

### I. Program Administration (type of staffing and functions needed)

Program Administrator (any clinical or technical staff)

- Identify patients who are eligible for lung cancer screening and share the materials below with the patient.
- Schedule a time for the patient to meet with a provider to discuss the LCSDecTool with them.

#### **Provider** (any clinical staff)

• Meet with the patient and answer any questions that they may have about lung cancer screening. Review pages 14–34 with the patient to understand their perspectives on lung cancer screening.

## II. Program Delivery

• LCSDecTool: A PDF document with lung cancer screening information for the patient and provider to review.

### **B. Program Implementation**

The steps used to implement this program are as follows:

- **Step 1:** Download and print the LCSDecTool.
- **Step 2:** Instruct the patient to review the program materials and complete pages 16–37.
- Step 3: Schedule a meeting for the patient and provider to discuss the completed materials.
- **Step 4:** The provider should review the pictogram on page 14 and assess the patient's responses from pages 16–37.
- **Step 5:** The provider and patient should discuss lung cancer screening, with special attention to pages highlighted for collaborative review.
