

Internet Access Locations in DC Metro Area

Washington, DC

Most area public libraries offer free internet access with sound capability. However, you will need to provide your own headphones to listen to audio on the website. You will need to provide a library card to sign up, which can be obtained by showing an official ID (for example, a driver's license, work badge, or passport). You do not need to be a DC resident to apply for a library card. There is a 1 hour time limit each time you use this service. If you are not a MD resident, you may obtain a visitor card for a small fee. There is a 1 hour time limit and access is limited to once per day.
